## Visiting protocols from 01 April 2022

We hope you are all well and enjoying the longer days that British Summertime brings. As we're sure many of you are aware the Government has announced its next steps on 'living with Covid' and we are are writing to clarify what this means for you and our staff as of 1st April:

- 1. Visitors to our homes and hospitals will no longer need to take an LFD test before visiting but must continue to wear a face mask provided by the service.
- 2. We will no longer ask you to book a visit so you can now visit freely as appropriate
- 3. Our staff will continue to test twice weekly when prevalence of COVID-19 is high, but not as a matter of course, and this will be the same for any relatives or friends who are providing personal care.
- 4. The prevalence of COVID-19 will be determined by the Government and is currently determined to be high and therefore our staff, and relatives or friends who are providing personal care, must test twice weekly.
- 5. Residents and patients will be tested if they display symptoms of COVID-19 but will not be regularly tested otherwise.
- 6. In a local outbreak only one visitor will be permitted to visit, and this person can be interchangeable providing they take an LFD test and wear PPE.
- 7. You can now spend time on your visit in communal areas more freely.
- 8. Residents and patients will have much more freedom to go out and will no longer need to isolate on return from a high risk area or have to test upon return to the care home.
- 9. If a resident or patient does test positive they will need to isolate for 10 days unless they test negative for 2 consecutive days after 5 days of isolation.
- 10. If an outbreak occurs the service will now be closed to visiting for 10 days rather than 14 days and of course we will inform you of this as appropriate.

We are delighted that we are now moving into the next phase, and whilst we are still living with COVID-19 we are able to continue to get back to a more normal way of life. We will be supporting all of our residents, patients and staff to take up the COVID booster vaccination, as we continue to believe that this remains the best protection for them.

Whilst we appreaciate there are still protocols to follow in order to do all we can to keep residents patients and staff safe, we hope you agree that this feels like another positive step forward. There is lots to look forward to this Spring with celebrations for Easter, the Queens unofficial birthday-



combined with National Tea Day, National Gardening Week and Dementia Action Week to name just a few, and we will be creating exciting menus and planning immersive activities for all to enjoy. We also continue to work with our partners for our virtual live events programme, hosting tours and talks from Cliveden National Trust, the Wallace Collection Museum as well as a selection of authors for our Book Club Corner events.

This time of year is also the time we launch our Care Awards. As some of you know this happens every year, and celebrates excellence in the quality of care we provide by giving recognition to individuals and teams that make a difference to the lives of the residents, patients and families they support.
